



What are Micro-Internships?

Shortly defined, Micro-Internships are short-term, paid, professional work experiences, like those given to new hires or interns. One project can range from 5-40 hours in duration. All projects are paid, and most are remote, making them accessible to all students. They offer students a free opportunity to work with real companies to develop their skills while exploring career paths and job functions. Micro-Internships are facilitated via the [Parker Dewey platform](#).

Qualifications:

- Must be 18 years or older
- No previous work experience required
- Open to students with CPT, OPT or a work visa

Getting Started: Once you [register with Parker Dewey](#) as a Career Launcher, you can review open Micro-Internship requests. This provides details of the engagement, including the expected deliverable, anticipated time commitment, due date, industry, and compensation. Simply click to apply and respond to any project-specific follow-up questions asked by the client. The company reviews incoming applicants and if selected, you will be notified of the next steps.
